(A). FLOODING:

Further flooding was also reported at Denham Lane and Pippin Street.

#### (B). WITHNELL FOLD NATURE RESERVE:

The County Council was to undertake some work at the site. The Parish Council would look into the improvement of the public footpath from Water Street to the nature reserve in conjunction with the landowner.

Members had walked the route and submitted comments relating to work required

Further discussions would take place on a programme of work.

It was suggested that this should form part of an application to Chorley Council's Northern Parishes Neighbourhood Priorities Scheme.

#### (C). GINNEL SMITHY CLOSE:

Following an inspection of the Smithy Close and Sandy Lane ginnel it was considered that it did not need complete re-surfacing. There were two potential trip hazards around the manhole and the concrete around a fence post that needed attention.

The owner had been notified of her ownership of the ginnel.

A contractor had been contacted for an estimate of the cost of the work.

#### (D). PIPPIN FOLD - PIPPIN STREET:

The County Council had indicated that the hump at Pippin Fold – Pippin Street did not form part of the adopted highway and as such was outside their responsibility.

County Councillor Cullens would be asked to visit the site along with Members of the Parish Council to view the situation.

## (E). GRIT BINS:

The County Council was still assessing the junction of Oram Road to see if it was a suitable location for a bin.

County Councillor Cullens would be asked to look into this.

The grit bin at Lower Copthurst needed refilling and the County Council had been asked to do this, sanding our velous interest as a special decrease of the manager

They had informed the Parish Council that the bin did not belong to them. Investigations would be undertake to ascertain ownership.

(F). STREET SWEEPING: Chorley Council had been requested to sweep Duxon Hill Sandy Lane and Water Street. In the month control of the month of the control of the co

Chorley Council would be asked again about the sweeping of Duxon Hill.

## (G). PARKING - WATER STREET:

A local resident had complained about the parking of cars on the pavement when attending church services forcing pedestrians to walk in the road. He had contacted Chorley Council about this and had been informed that he should take up this matter with the County Council. County Councillor Cullens was informed and had suggested the Church Authorities should be approached.



(H). DENHAM LANE:

The Chairman (Councillor D, Cranshaw) reported that he had informed Chorley Council about fly tipping on Denham Lane and at Denham Quarry. This had been removed.
